This was set-up to ensure that bad rules are changed and good rules are strong—not to provide a power base for any individual or committee.

Despite my travel schedule I will be actively joining the Club rides now the "Beast" is back on the road.

I would like to thanks Sparra for the very generous loan of his Bike for a couple of weeks and Sugar is also very grateful because she knows that I can get a little testy if I don't ride regularly, so thanks heaps mate!

Ynot's Blurb—February 2010

Hi all.

We are well into the New Year, and the club is going from strength to strength. There have been a wide variety of rides, which have been very well attended, and we are still attracting new members and visitors to our events.

With the imminent release of our By-Laws, several members have approached me informally with some concerns, so I would like to address those concerns and clarify some of the misunderstandings that may be occurring.

First of all, to become incorporated, Office of Fair Trading requires that we have a set of Rules for the club. These Rules must comply with the relevant act and be approved by Office of Fair Trading before we could gain incorporation. Once accepted by the Office of Fair Trading these Rules can only be changed by way of a special resolution carried at a monthly meeting. Any change must then be validated by registering it with the Chief Executive of the Office of Fair Trading. As we are now incorporated we have a set of Rules in place.

When we were writing the Rules, in addition to complying with the relevant act, we had make sure that the desired culture of the club could be fostered whilst simultaneously sticking to the Rules. The culture that we wanted to foster was one that encouraged at least the following;

- Participation by all members,
- Democratic decision making,
- Equality for all members,
- Freedom to express an opinion without fear of retribution or criticism,
- Transparency of processes,
- Fun and enjoyment for all,
- Election of office bearers,
- The ability to change as required by the membership.

The Rules, which must not be broken during the club's daily operations, provide general guidance for the club, and in many cases require much more detailed explanation so that they can be adhered to without ambiguity and misinterpretation.

Therefore, to ensure the desired club culture is maintained within the parameters of the Rules, it is necessary to add procedures, methods, guidelines, instructions, protocols and By-Laws to the Rules to assist in the daily operations. The use of these different titles for similar things often makes the resulting document very difficult to follow and leads to the problems of conflict, misunderstanding, ambiguity and confusion that we are trying to avoid. Therefore we have referred to them simply as By-Laws.

Rule number 42(1) states that, "the management committee may make, amend or repeal By-Laws not inconsistent with these rules for the internal management of the association". So long as any By-Law is not inconsistent with the Rules, the Management Committee can further refine the Rules to enhance the association's operations. So we have produced the By-Laws, and hopefully increased clarity, and eliminated any ambiguity.

The intention of the By-Laws is not to control and restrict members, but to provide guidance to all members so that we all achieve as much enjoyment from the club as we desire. If there is a fear that we are recreating the dictatorial, restrictive, controlling and confusing environment some of us have witnessed elsewhere, then you only have to refer to the desired culture identified above to see that this is not our intention.

If there is a By-Law that you want to change or remove, you can do this quite simply. Rule number 42(2) states, "A By-Law may be set aside by a majority vote of members at a monthly meeting of the association". The democratic, participative, transparent nature of our processes is protected by the Rules and this in turn is reflected in the By-Laws.

Here are a couple of examples to illustrate the user-friendly nature of the By-Laws.

- If you wanted to know what was involved in the role of Tail End Charlie, by searching the Index (or Directory) for Tail End Charlie you get referred to Roles, and Roles Tail-end-Charlie currently refers you to By-Law 19(j) on page 19. This explains exactly what Tail End Charlie is expected to do.
- If you wanted to know what the ride rules are, you would look in the Index (or Directory) for Ride Rules and currently this refers you to By-Law 17(b) on page 13, where the ride rules are detailed.

The By-Laws are intended to be a constant work in progress that can easily be changed during the process of continuous improvement. As previously stated they are intended to help, not restrict or impede your enjoyment of the club. We must never forget the purpose of our club as identified in Rule number 3. Objects. "The objects of the association are to encourage members to regularly meet, ride and join together for social enjoyment."

I request that you reserve judgement of the By-Laws until you have read them, then you are encouraged to discuss them and debate them as much as you want. Discussion and debate will be encouraged at all times.

On a different note, there was only one nomination for Riders' Delegate and that was Rowdy. Congratulations Rowdy, you officially take up the role at the commencement of the February meeting. As By-Law 19(g) states, "the purpose of the Riders' Delegate is to be the representative for all rider members on the Management Committee, and be the first point of communication for any issues of concern or clarification." Until we have Delegates for Pillions and Social members, the Riders' Delegate will represent them also.

On a lighter note, a special welcome to our latest member Baz, the man of great literary prowess.

I need a ride after all this heavy stuff, see you on the next one.

History of Motorcycles—part 1

Throughout the centuries man has striven to expand his capabilities through the use of machines. His ever inventive mind has constantly devised ways to use tools to increase his abilities to explore the world around him, to go faster, deeper, higher and further than before. Coupled with his need to find new thrills, new adventures and new modes of transportation, the invention and refinement of the motorcycle seems an inevitable outcome.

The early years of the development of the motorcycle are especially fascinating as they hold of some of mans most bizarre experimental machinery. Before we get started on the history of the motorcycle itself, a short review of it's predecessor, namely the bicycle, is in order, an invention without which the motor bicycle, as they were first called, may well have never come about.

It's claimed that Michelangelo conceived of the bicycle as early as the 14th century and this drawing supposedly by him, has a remarkable resemblance to the modern day bicycle. It had wheels of similar size and pedals and a leather "chain", but no apparent means of steering. Others however, claim this drawing was added later and is a hoax.



Though never built, it was a remarkably cleaver design, and early bicycle makers would have done well to study this con-

cept. There have, in fact, been 4 machines built based on this drawing, attesting to the viability of his design.

The first attempt at actually producing any sort of 2 wheeled conveyance fell on the shoulders of one Comte de Sivrac in the late 1791, though hardy a bicycle as we un-

derstand the meaning today. It was crude affair made entirely of wood with no pedals, brakes or even steering. This early machine was referred to as a hobbyhorse and was considered nothing more than a curiosity, or rich mans folly, an attitude that remained for a number of years, until the late 1800's. A person simply sat upon it and pushed it along with their feet in a sort of gliding walk.





Then in 1816-17 (depending on the source) Baron van Drais revised the concept to include a steerable front wheel, but his machine still lacked pedals or brakes, so wasn't much of an improvement.

Weighing 23 kg it was not much better than walking and could not have been fun on any sort of hill, either going up or down! The lack of comfort and condition of roads at the time gave rise to the term "boneshaker" which stuck with two wheeled vehicles for

some time.

Then in 1869 a William van Anden in New York added pedals directly to the front wheel. Now at last we approach what can be called by modern terms, a bicycle. It also had free-wheeling pedals that allowed the wheel to turn while the pedals remained stationary and had a friction brake on the rear wheel operated by twisting one of the hand grips. Oddly enough these innovations did not appear on many other machines for quite some time.

It quickly became apparent however that the only way to increase speed or distance travelled, per rotation of the pedals, was to increase the size of the front wheel, leading to what became known as the High Wheeler.

Unfortunately because of the high centre of gravity and forward position of the rider, not only was some skill required to mount and dismount this contraption, but should the front wheel suddenly stop, the rider was thrown forward on his head, thus giving rise to the term "Taking a Header".
